

## Human Biology 2015-2016 Assessment Report

1. Please give a brief overview of the assessment data you collected this year.

Results. Internships are required for Human Biology majors with the nutritional science emphasis to become registered dieticians. Placement (i.e., "matching") is competitive with a 50% match rate nationally. The match rate for the Human Biology students during the assessment cycle relevant to this report was 100%.

2. How will you use what you've learned from the data that was collected?

Two reasons have been identified to explain the success of this outcome. First, the curriculum of the program exceeds the minimum requirements for students to become registered dieticians. For example, nutritional science students at UW-Green Bay are required to take upper-level courses in physiology and microbiology. Two, curricular content is visionary. For example, nutrigenomics appeared early in the curriculum of the program at UW-Green Bay relative to other programs throughout the country.

To continue this level of success, Human Biology plans to continue to build on the knowledge and skills of the students. To do so, professional development opportunities for faculty/staff and retaining/hiring quality staff/faculty are critical to continue and build upon the success of the program outlined in this report.
