Transfer Plan Highlights:

- Fully accredited by the Council on Social Work Education, the BSW program facilitates student mastery of national practice competencies through coursework and internship
- BSW graduates are eligible for state certification as social workers
- 56 credits transfer from NWTC to UW-Green Bay and provide junior-level academic standing
- Possible to complete your BSW degree in 2 years of full-time study including summer terms
- Part-time options available for working adults

Course Transfer Conditions

- This transfer plan does not guarantee admission to the UWGB Social Work program. Students must apply and be accepted to the UWGB Social Work in order to pursue the BSW degree.
- The table on page 2 details course to course equivalencies
- The table on page 3-5 details additional requirements students must complete in order to earn the BSW degree. Students must complete all UWGB residency requirements in order to graduate.
- Students choosing a major other than Social Work will have different and/or additional requirements to complete.
- NWTC courses taken outside of the Substance Abuse Counseling degree program will be evaluated on a course by course basis.
