The school was established by legislature in 1965 and opened for classes in 1968. Since then UW-Green Bay has built 17 major buildings on the 700-acre campus.

Campus Apartments Rate is **\$2,106** for one-fourth of a furnished, two-bedroom apartment with bathroom, kitchen and living room, for nine months. Doubles, singles and private-room apartments at higher rates are also available.

Residence Halls Rate is **\$1,978** or **\$2,106** per student for a nine-month contract for a room shared with one other person. Dormitory residents must purchase the food plan.
