passed to **Dr. Denise Scheberle**. As the new IST Executive Committee Chair, Dr. Scheberle has responsibility for the curriculum of the Adult Degree Program.

A member of the UW-Green Bay faculty since 1992, Dr. Scheberle serves as Professor and Chair of Public and Environmental Affairs, and has taught with the Adult Degree Program for several years. Dr. Scheberle also served as Interim Associate Dean of Liberal Arts and Science from 2000-2002 and currently serves as Chair of the campus Chancellor's Search Committee and Co-Director of the Teaching Scholars Program. She is currently a Commissioner at the Green Bay Metropolitan Sewerage District and is past president of the Public Policy Section of the American Political Science Association. She earned both her bachelor's and master's degrees from the University of Wyoming, and her Ph.D. in Political Science from Colorado State University in 1991. Her research interests are public management and environmental policy and law.

Denise Scheberle's accomplishments – on campus, within the UW System, and in the Green Bay community – are vast and include numerous published works and refereed papers as well as several awards, including the 2004 UW System Board of Regents Award for Excellence in Teaching and the Founder's Association's award for teaching excellence. ### *Blazing a trail between Green Bay and the Northwoods*

Last May witnessed the introduction of a new initiative designed to bring a UW System bachelor’s degree into Northern Wisconsin. This effort, a partnership between UW-Green Bay’s Adult Degree Program and Nicolet College in Rhinelander, is providing increased access to a UW System bachelor’s degree to local residents. Further, it has captured the attention of local business and industry in the “Grow North” region of Forest, Langlade, Lincoln, Oneida, and Vilas counties.

This new effort is starting this fall with over 25 students enrolling in the Adult Degree Program from the Northwoods. The first UWGB class

## Need Assistance With Your Writing? Help Is In Store For You!

### *Writing Center now accepting assignments electronically from Adult Degree Program students*

Through a special agreement with the Adult Degree Program, the UWGB Writing Center will now accept written assignments from Adult Degree students through e-mail and Writing Center staff will respond through e-mail with constructive criticism for you. The electronic submission process is available only to students enrolled in UWGB's Adult Degree Program. We understand that it is often not possible for working adult students to make an appointment and travel to the campus on weekdays in order to take advantage of this wonderful opportunity offered through our Writing Center.

#### **Here's How It Works**

**At least a week in advance of the due date for your paper**, send an email with your completed paper attached in Word format to Dr. Brian Sutton, Director of the Writing Center. His email address is [suttonb@uwgb.edu](mailto:suttonb@uwgb.edu). Indicate that you are an Adult Degree student and include a description of the assignment from your professor. Prof. Sutton will assign it to a staff member. Drafts submitted early in the semester will probably be returned within a week, with suggested revisions. Later in the semester, when the Writing Center staff is much busier, turnaround time may be a bit longer than a week.

#### **More Information**

- The Writing Center's goals are to help you become a better writer and to enable you to fix your own writing problems.
- The Writing Center staff will evaluate your writing and suggest possible revisions on such topics as content, organization, style, citation, format, and appropriateness for the assignment.
- The papers will be reviewed in one hour segments called "appointments." Normally, just one hour will be given to each paper. However, electronic responses require more time than traditional appointments. So if your paper requires more time you will need to request another appointment.
- When e-mailing in a paper, you should also send a copy of the writing assignment itself.
- The working draft of the paper being reviewed should be completed and submitted to the Writing Center long before the paper is due.
- The Writing Center will point out the categories of your most frequent or most serious punctuation and grammar errors, then explain the rules governing those errors so that you can find and correct those errors yourself.  
**Please note that the Writing Center's staff will not go through your paper and correct all punctuation and grammar errors for you.**

- You might consider buying a copy of Diana Hacker's book *A Pocket Style Manual*, 5th edition, from the campus bookstore. The book gives guidelines for grammar, punctuation, writing style, citation format, and a range of other elements of good writing. If you let Writing Center tutors know that you have a copy of *A Pocket Style Manual*, then when they give you advice about your papers, they can suggest sections of the book for you to consult to help you improve your writing.

The Writing Center operates through the regular school year, but is not available over the summer session. This means that assistance in the fall is available from **Sept. 2 – Dec. 10, 2008** and in spring between **Jan. 26 – May 8, 2009**.

### Registration for Spring '09 Semester Classes to begin on November 10

Students are advised that registration for spring courses will begin for students with senior status on **Monday, November 10**. However, your actual registration date and time may vary, depending on your student standing, which is based on your number of earned credits at the time of registration. In order to find out your registration date and time, log onto your Student Center through your S.I.S. account. On the right side of the page you will see a box that says, "Registration Appointment." Click on the "Details" link and it will show you the first date and time of day that you will be allowed to register for classes. Registration can be performed yourself or you can talk/meet with your advisor for advice on courses that will work best for you.

#### Wish List...

Students wanting to build their wish list of classes for the coming semester can do so beginning on November 10. The link for this function is found at the upper-left portion of your Student Center and can be used to check for time/date conflicts, prerequisite issues, or other issues that may cause problem as you register for classes. This is an effective way to prepare for registration.

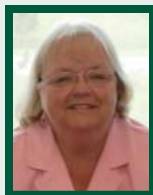

**Dr. Jan Thornton**, Associate Provost of Outreach and Adult Access and Director of the Adult Degree Program, served as leader of a citizens group that has been nominated to receive a Wisconsin Lake Stewardship Award as presented by the Wisconsin Association of Lakes, the state DNR, and UW-Extension. Dr. Thornton was volunteer

chairperson for the Gibson Island Project, a million-dollar campaign to purchase for preservation a 25-acre parcel on the Cloverleaf Chain of Lakes near Clintonville. The project ranks among the largest citizen-led conservation acquisitions of its kind in the region. The nomination for the annual state award is active for two years, with consideration for the spring 2009 and 2010 award ceremonies.
