## APPLICATION PROCEDURES

### **Applying to UWGB:**

Due to enrollment limits established for UW-Green Bay, students are **strongly encouraged to make early application**. Apply online at: [apply.wisconsin.edu](http://apply.wisconsin.edu). Applications for admission may be submitted beginning September 1 for the following summer or fall (August 1 for spring semester).

### **Applying to the Major:**

There is no formal application process for the Information Sciences major or minor.

**Filing an academic plan for the major/minor:** All students are required to officially file the “Declaration of Major Form” by the time 62 credits are earned or in progress. New transfer students entering UWGB with 62 or more credits (determined by number of credits awarded through credit evaluation) are required to file the plan during the first semester of enrollment.
