Darkroom Assistant	X	X		Due to the dangerous nature and precision required with photographic chemistry the darkroom stays open by volunteers called Darkroom assistants. These student volunteers give up 5 hours of their time watch week to supervise the darkroom. In exchange these students are given a key to allow them 24 hours 7 day a week access. As well they are given a large cabinet to keep their supplies. Each darkroom assistant learns how to do perform minor maintenance such as changing light bulbs on enlargers and how to mix chemistry. In addition this opportunity is an excellent practical line on the resume that can make a student shine to employers with darkrooms or graduate schools.
