

Rockland 4-H Club makes donation to Camp Lloyd

As part of the Rockland 4-H Club's Community Service Program, this year the group has chosen Camp Lloyd at UW-Green Bay to financially assist with their summer program. The week-long camp is filled with activities such as arts and crafts, music, games, swimming and hiking. It is also a time for campers to explore their own experiences of grief, realize that their feelings are normal and find support from each other. The Camp Lloyd staff consists of professional grief counselors and trained student interns from the UW-Green Bay campus.

The club presented two separate donations. The first donation was based on a donation to the Rockland 4-H club received from the family of Dorothy Wozniak. Their fundraiser is the annual Dorothy Wozniak Memorial Golf Outing. Wozniak was a resident of the town of Rockland, a past 4-H leader and was a member of the Brown County Country Critters Homemakers Club who passed away on Sept. 11, 2005, from cancer. She was survived by her husband Mike, and three children: Cheryl, Julie, and Mark. She was very involved with

her children, their activities, community youth programs and always wanted everyone to look at the simple ways of life and how to spend quality time with family and friends.

Club Treasurer Amanda Fabry presented Ilene C. Noppe, PhD Professor of Human Development/Women's Studies/Psychology Affiliate - Human Development - UW-Green Bay, with a check for \$250 to the Camp Lloyd project in Dorothy's name.

After learning of the Camp Lloyd project and what their needs were for the upcoming June camp, the club voted to match Wozniak's memorial donation with an additional \$250 from the Rockland 4-H club. This money was raised over the past year at food stands at the Wisconsin Equestriane Center in Rockland, at the Creekview Horse Shows and from premiums made at the Brown County Fair for their 4-H scrapbook, plant and booth.

After the presentation, Noppe talked about the camp, why it is needed and what their plans were for the donation. She also shared with some highlights of her recent trip to Africa.
