FULL ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

To be considered for full admission to the Program students must:

1. Complete the Candidate Application Process and be Accepted as a Program Candidate. Students seeking admission to the Program must first complete the “Application for Candidate Status” process and be accepted as a Program Candidate.
2. Complete at least forty (40) semester credits of university course work with a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.75. The cumulative grade point average will be based on all courses completed for graded credit at UW-Green Bay and other institutions recognized for transfer credit to UW-Green Bay. In addition, students seeking certification are required to have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.75, receive a grade of “B” or higher in all major/minor coursework and maintain a 2.75 GPA or higher in all major/minor coursework.

Important Note for Transfer or Re-Entry Students. Students who have not been enrolled in college for at least two years may choose to use the cumulative GPA from all college course work ever attempted or the GPA earned, after the two-year break, if that recent course work includes at least one full-time semester (a minimum of 12 credits). For students seeking certification, the minimum GPA in their major/minor courses must be 2.75 with no grade lower than “B” and a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or higher.

3. Complete EDUC 290 Introduction to Educational Inquiry with a grade of “B” or better. This includes approval of the first section of electronic portfolio.
4. Obtain satisfactory recommendation(s) from PK-12 teacher(s). The classroom teacher who has direct knowledge of your experience with PK-12 students, as part of the EDUC 290 course, completes this report. Additional recommendations may be submitted.
5. Obtain a satisfactory recommendation from the instructor of the Introduction to Educational Inquiry course. The instructor of the EDUC 290 Introduction to Educational Inquiry course completes this report. Additional recommendations may be submitted.
6. Complete and submit the Application for Full Admission. This application will be handed out in EDUC 290 at midterm and should be completed and returned to your EDUC 290 Instructor.

It is the Student’s responsibility to make certain the Admission Application documents listed above are on file in the Education Office no later than the last day of classes. Incomplete application files will not be reviewed for admission.

Admission to the Program is a highly competitive process. Meeting these minimum requirements does not guarantee my acceptance and is subject to the approval of the Admissions Committee. The admission committee may consider up to 10% of applicants who do not meet GPA and/or PPST II criteria.
