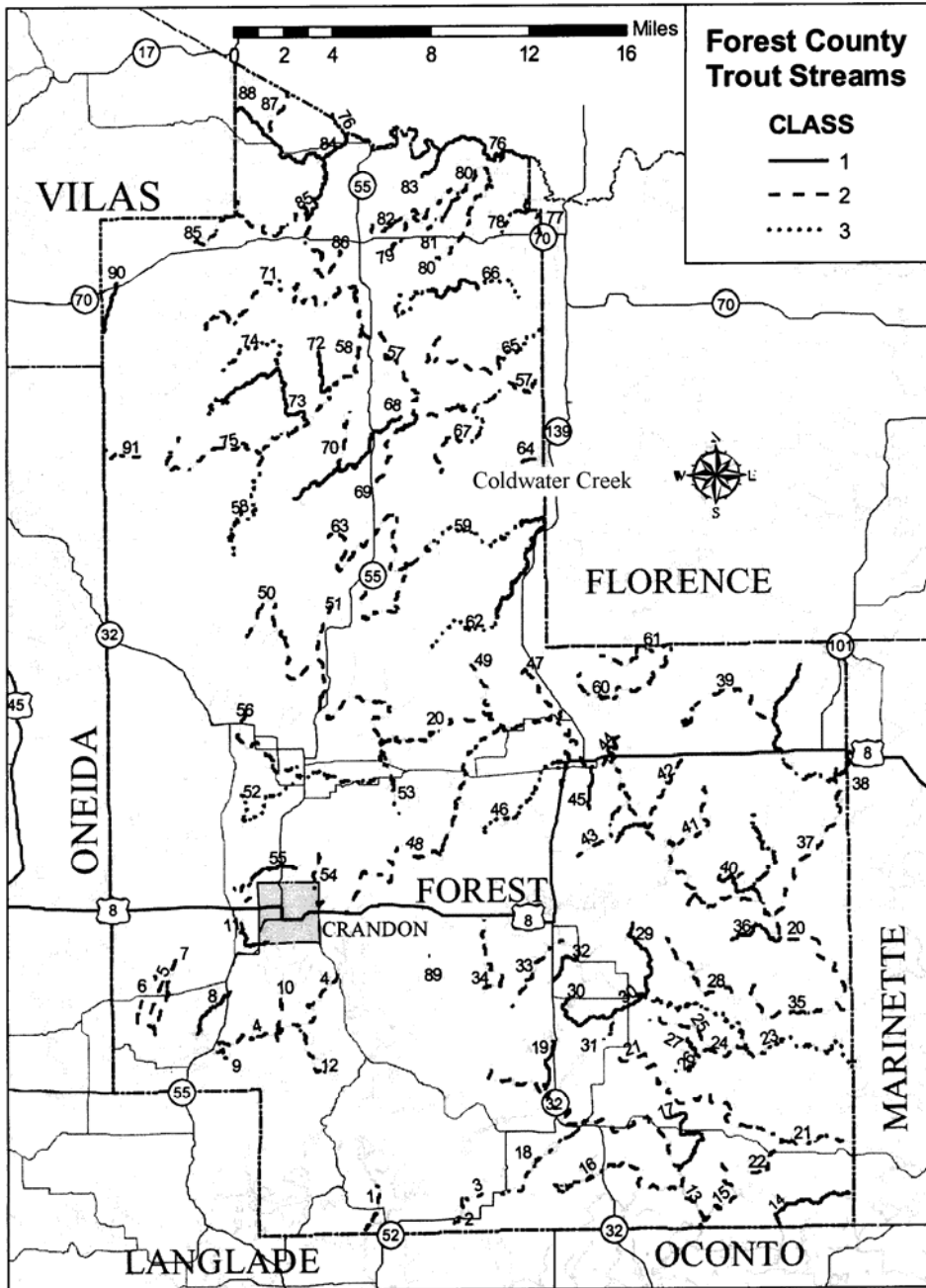

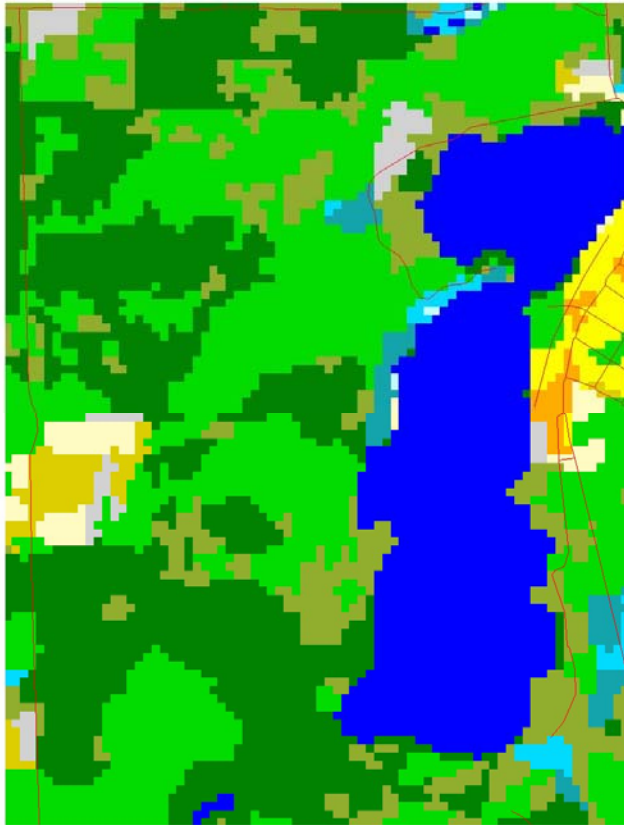
9.5 Forest County, Wisconsin Trout Stream Map Including Cold Water Creek (WDNR 2003)
