## Winter Semester Schedule

January 3 (T)	Undergraduate special student registration begins.
January 10-13	Orientation for new students
January 14 (Sa)	\$50 withdrawal fee goes into effect.
January 16 (M)	University closed; Martin Luther King, Jr. Day.
January 17 (T)	Semester begins.
January 20 (F)	Tuition and fees are due no later than 4:30 p.m.
January 21 (Sa)	\$100 withdrawal fee goes into effect.
January 27 (F)	Academic Add deadline for all semester length courses. Academic deadline to change from grade to pass-no credit. Academic deadline to change from pass-no credit to grade. Academic deadline to change from audit to credit for grading purposes.
January 28 (Sa)	Drops and withdrawals result in DR or W on records. Drops and withdrawals result in refund of 50% of tuition and fees.
February 11 (Sa)	Financial Drop/Withdrawal deadline (no tuition & fee refund).
February 24 (F)	Academic Drop deadline for all semester length courses.
Mar 18-26 (Sa-Su)	Spring Recess.

## Work Options

### OPT

**Optional Practical Training** allows students to work for up to one year after graduation in their field of study.

**How to apply**—2-3 months before your graduation date. Processing usually takes around 90 days. It is best to get your application in early.

Pick up an application form in Rose Hall 311 and then meet with an OIE advisor.

### CPT

**Curricular Practical Training** allows students to participate in internships—paid or unpaid. Internships must be in the student's field of study. Students can participate in up to one year of CPT without affecting their OPT.

**How to apply.** Get an application from The Office of International Education and turn in your completed application to an Kristy or Brent. Please turn in your application at least 30 days before you plan on starting.

### Economic Hardship

Economic Hardship allows students to work off campus. It is only granted to students who have had a change in their support by an unforeseen circumstance.

**How to apply.** Pick up an application form in Rose Hall 311 and then meet with an OIE advisor.

## Change of Address or Major

If any students have changed addresses or your major and not told the Office of International Education, please notify Kristy Aoki, International Student Services Advisor. Part of maintaining your status as an F-1 or J-1 student is keeping current documentation about your address and major.



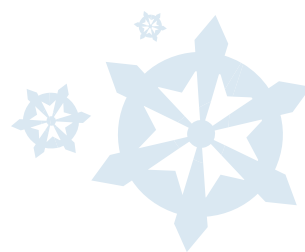
## Tuition Remission Scholarship

Applications for Tuition Remission Scholarships must be completed annually. The application deadline for fall 2006 scholarships is due to the Office of International Education by April 15<sup>th</sup>. Please keep in mind that applications are evaluated based on the following criteria :

- **financial need**
- **academic performance**
- **extracurricular involvement** Being involved in on-Campus events such as International Education Week, the International Dinner, Student Government, etc. greatly influence your ability to receive a scholarship....so don't hesitate...be involved!

## Holiday Travel

F-1 students who are planning on traveling out side the country over winter break must come to the Office of International Education and have their I-20 signed. Please come in at least 1 week before you would like to travel. Please fill out an application available in Rose Hall 311 and turn it into Kristy or Brent. It is also important to look into any visa requirement countries may have regarding travel.

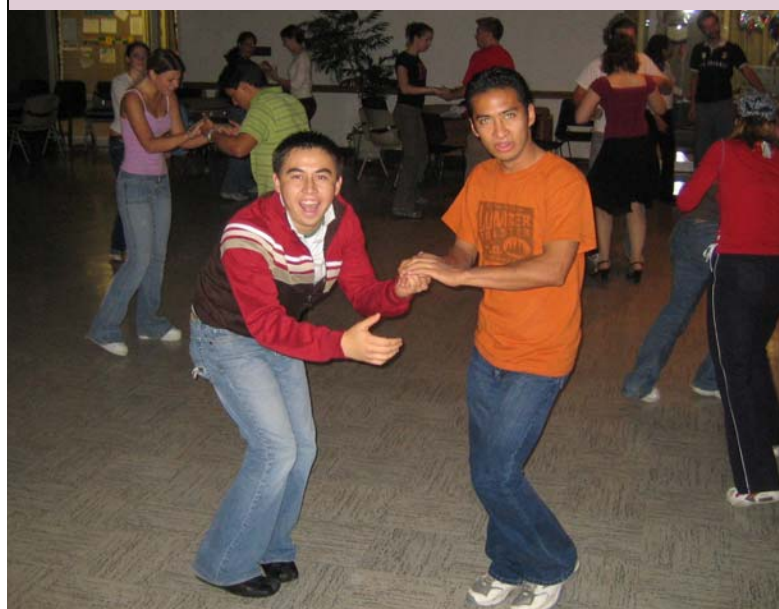

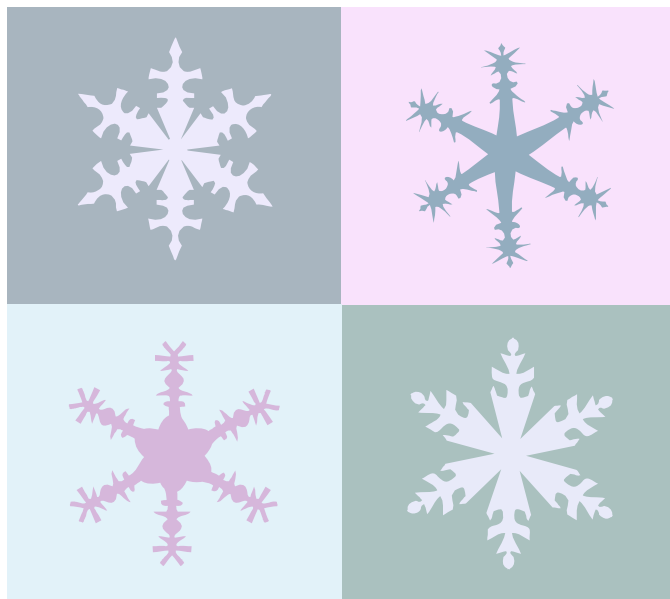
