1. **Neville Public Museum-Green Bay, WI, USA**
<http://www.nevillepublicmuseum.org/exhibits/the-traitor-state> - February 9th to August 17th of 2008, the Neville Public Museum will be hosting an exhibit on the "Traitor State," in reference to the beliefs that Wisconsin was disloyal to the war effort. Service records of individuals from Brown County are the inspiration for the creation of this website.
2. **EAA-Oshkosh, WI, USA**

11. **Imperial War Museum - United Kingdom**

12. **National Maritime Museum- London, England**

16. **Kobariški muzej (Kobariski Museum)**

(Available in English, Slovene, Italian, and German) The different rooms of the Kobariski Museum in Kobarid, Slovenia, present different experiences of the fronts during the war. Photos and sculptures made by soldiers bring the experiences they had to life. A 5 kilometer outdoor historical trail/tour covers areas of historical importance in the surrounding area.

17. **Museo della Guerra Bianca-Adamello, Italy**

Known as the White War in Italy, the Alps created a different fighting front. Documents, photos, and military goods are located in this World War One focused Italian museum.
