- Ability to Join with the Family
- Balance of Problem Focus with Strength Focus
- Consistency of Worker

Family Factors

- Insight into Problems
- Perceptions from Prior Involvement with Child Welfare
- Resources - Lower Overall Stress Level
- Ability to Identify and Articulate Strengths
- Sense of Family Identity and Attachment
- Vision of a Better Life
