You are able to track your degree progress through the UW-Green Bay Student Information System. With advisor approval, requirements may be fulfilled by courses at other institutions. Taking courses at other institutions may affect eligibility for All University (Latin) Honors. You need at least 120 credits to graduate with at least 30 upper level nursing credits and 30 residency credits. There is a possibility to double count one course toward two categories if the number of credits transferred allows for it. For example:
