Course Objectives: This survey course is designed to introduce students to the broad field of Psychology. The study of psychology provides us with a unique opportunity to observe, measure, and appreciate the diversity of animal and human behaviors.

Syllabus: The syllabus is a general outline including some of the material we will cover in this course. There will be additional material and, on occasion, some chapter material may be abbreviated or omitted.

Examination Policy: Exams will not be given before the designated test period. Make-up exams will be given only when and if the student provides a valid excuse. Vacation travel plans are not considered valid excuses.

Examination Format: Bring two #2 lead pencils with erasers. Tests usually include 50 multiple-choice questions. Test questions will be drawn from lecture material, the textbook, and the student study guide.

Experiential Research Learning Program (ERLP)

- **Research Credits:** Students are required to earn 8 research credits. These credits can be earned by participating in research studies, attending research presentations, and/or reading and reviewing relevant research articles (1 research credit = .25 hours of research experience). All students enrolled in this course are enrolled in the Experiential Research Learning Program (ERLP) D2L page. This page will advertise opportunities for students to earn research credits, allow students to track the credits they have already earned, and has other useful links and information.
- **To earn research credits:**
 - Log on to the ERLP D2L page often to see what opportunities are available.
 - Sign up or show up for the activity (some activities require students to sign up ahead of time and some studies do not).
 - Following the activity, students print their name on a credit sheet which is given to the ERLP coordinator who will assign credit.
- **Important:**
 - Be sure to read the “Information for Students” document on the ERLP D2L page. This will give you other valuable information about the program.
 - Sign up for research activities as early in the term as possible (so you don’t miss the opportunity later).
 - You may only participate in research activities posted on the ERLP D2L page to receive credit for this class.
 - Students who sign up for a research activity but do not attend and do not cancel 24 hours ahead of time will receive a penalty equal to the number of credits offered for the activity. These negative credits can be reversed by participation in additional ERLP events.
 - You may only participate in the same research study once unless notified in advance.
