






STAY ON CAMPUS, TAKE IN A SHOW.



**Students who reside in Menominee County, Michigan are eligible for Wisconsin resident rates under the Michigan Compact.

***Students who demonstrate previous success in high school or post-secondary institutions that reside in the remaining 14 counties that make up Upper Michigan will be eligible for this award NOTE: Online courses will be charged an additional \$25 per credit distance education fee.

SCHOLARSHIPS

UW-Green Bay is proud to offer more than \$900,000 in non-athletic scholarship funding every year. The University also joins with community and national organizations to provide access to privately funded scholarship options.

To be considered for a Freshman University Scholarship, students with a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher (on a 4.0 scale) and an ACT score of 23 or higher or an SAT score of 1130 or higher, should apply by the priority application date of **February 15**.


