1. Please review last year's assessment results (2014-2015) with the faculty in your program. How does your program plan to take these results into consideration in future programmatic planning?

The basic gist of our assessment was to see if we were meeting our stated program goals for Creative Writing across the creative writing curriculum (the specific outcome was "writing in multiple genres/forms").
