Jan 15 **Bomber** (USA, 2009). A bittersweet family drama tracing one veteran's efforts to make amends for the destruction he caused during World War II. Alistar, an 83-year old veteran decides to return to Germany for a long planned journey of atonement. When Ross, his useless son agrees to drive him there, a nightmare family road trip ensues. Present by Prof. David Coury (German, UW-Green Bay)

Feb 5 **Sound City** (USA, 2013). Nirvana drummer and Foo Fighter's guitarist Dave Grohl produced this documentary and tribute for rock music lovers. The film tells the history of Sound City and their huge recording device; exploring how digital change has allowed 'people that have no place' in music to become stars. Feb 19 **Hannah Arendt** (Germany, 2012) Acclaimed German director Margarethe von Trotta's re-telling of the life of philosopher and political theorist Hannah Arendt, who reported for *The New Yorker* on the war crimes trial of the Nazi Adolf Eichmann. Best known for coining the phrase "the banality of evil," Arendt closely followed the trial in Jerusalem and Eichmann's "Nuremberg defense" in which he argued that he was only following orders, and that he could not possibly be charged with war crimes. March 5 La Sirga (Columbia, 2012) Alice, a young Columbian refugee, is uprooted by armed conflict in her country. Memories of the war are constant, so she tries to reshape her life in La Sirga, a decadent hostel on the shores of a great lake in the highlands of the Andes. There she will try to settle down as fear and the threat of war threaten to resurface in this beautifully shot film that explores the impact of political violence. March 19 Italian Film Evening. The Green Bay Film Society again teams up with the Italo-Americano Club of Green Bay to present an evening of Italian cinema.

April 2 **Key of Life** (Japan, 2012) A case of stolen identity and one determined bride-to-be intersect in this comedy from famed Japanese filmmaker Kenji Uchida. Struggling actor Sakurai is out of work and out of luck. When a mysterious man slips and falls at the bathhouse, Sakurai switches locker keys and identities with the man, who turns out to be a hit man named Kondo. As the truth about Kondo and Sakurai comes to light, they must scramble to resolve the chaos of this topsy-turvy chain of events. Presented by Prof. Clif Ganyard (History, UW-Green Bay)

May 7 **Beer Hunter, the Movie** (USA, 2013) The Green Bay Film Society teams up with Titletown Brewery to present a documentary film about the beloved and influential beer and whiskey journalist Michael Jackson. His books on beer and whiskey have sold millions of copies, and his 1993 Discovery Channel television series, 'The Beer Hunter', has inspired brewers and beer enthusiasts and has shaped the course of the craft brewing.
