Campus Apartments Rate is **\$2,045** for one-fourth of a furnished, two-bedroom apartment with bathroom, kitchen and living room, for nine months. Doubles, singles and private-room apartments at higher rates are also available.

Residence Halls Rate is **\$1,920** to **\$2,045** per student for a nine-month contract for a room shared with one other person. Dormitory residents must purchase the food plan.

Food Plan **\$1,000** minimum required of students who live in residence halls.
