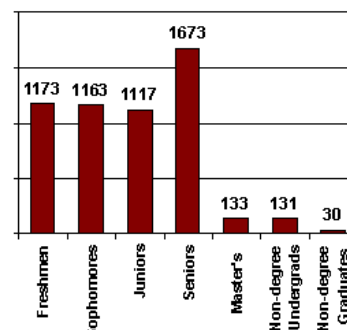

Some Facts About the Learning Environment at UW-Green Bay

Students complete an array of lectures, labs and discussion sections, and independent learning activities (such as internships and individual research projects).

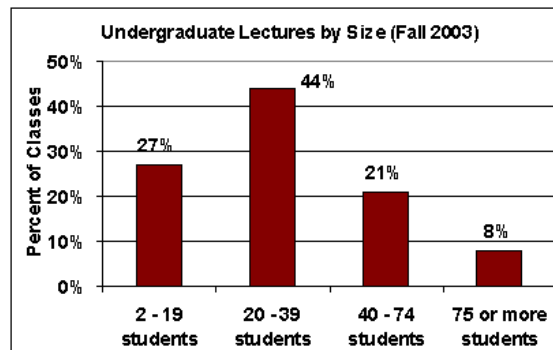
In a typical fall semester, students can choose from approximately 650 lecture courses and 100 labs or discussions.

Faculty and academic staff teach all lectures and most labs.

Approximately 4% of all credit is earned through independent activities.

Very few undergraduate lecture courses contain more than 75 students. Over a quarter are very small, with under 20 students. The most typical class contains between 20 and 40 students. The average size is 36 students.

UW-Green Bay's student-faculty ratio is 23-to-1.



*Data on the fact sheet come from enrollments after ten days of fall classes. These early enrollments may vary some from final enrollment figures, which will be prepared in mid-October. Enrollments in the Extended Degree Program from 1/1/2003 through 6/30/2003 are fully integrated throughout the fact sheet unless specifically noted. Students enrolled exclusively in Extension, Study Abroad, Grant-funded, or Remedial courses are excluded.
