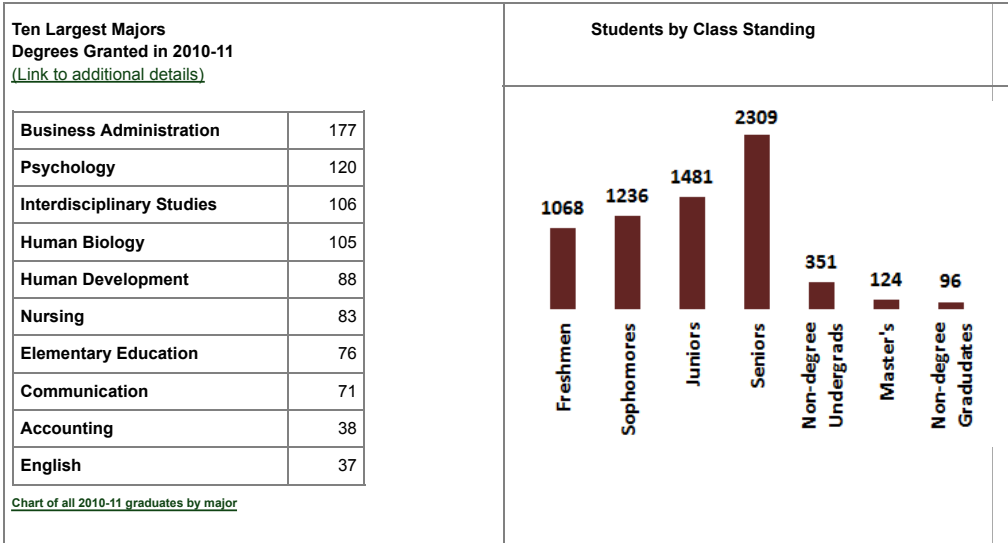

**Campus Apartments** Rent for a typical 4-student, 2-bedroom unit is **\$3,900** per student for the nine month year. Students who live in campus apartments are not required to purchase a food contract. [\(Link to Housing\)](#)  
**Residence Halls** Rent for a 2-student unit is **\$3,700** per student for the nine-month year. Residence hall residents must purchase a food plan although actual dining costs will vary depending on individual needs. Some Facts About the Learning Environment at UW-Green Bay

Students complete an array of lectures, labs and discussion sections, and independent learning activities (such as internships and individual research projects).

In Fall 2011, students enrolled in 699 sections of lecture courses and 116 labs and discussions.

Faculty and academic staff teach all lectures and most labs and discussions.

Approximately 11% of students are earning credit through independent activities, often in conjunction with regular classes.

Very few undergraduate lecture courses contain more than 75 students. Over a quarter are very small, with under 20 students. The most typical class contains between 20 and 40 students. The median class contains 26 students.

UW-Green Bay's student-faculty ratio is 25-to-1.
