The National Student Exchange (NSE) is a study away opportunity that allows you to take new courses, see new places, make new friends, and enroll in academic options that may not be available on your own campus. You can study for a single term or academic year at one of nearly 200 NSE member colleges and universities in the following locations:

- United States
- Guam
- Canada
- Puerto Rico
- U.S. Virgin Islands

Students can study at a partner university for the price of UWGB tuition and the host school housing costs!

Quick Facts:

- Minimum GPA: 2.5, some schools will require above a 2.5
- Courses/Disciplines: Most Majors and Minors
- Housing Options: Apartment, Residence Hall/Dormitory
- Number of Credits: 12-18

Placement at Host Schools:

Students are placed once a year at an annual conference. The University of Wisconsin- Green Bay is allowed to exchange with plan B schools. It is also important to contact the OIE for host campus placement availability before beginning an application.

Schools are listed on their "Campus Profiles" on the NSE.org website as follows:

- Open will accept all qualified applicants
- **Uneven** will accept a few more incoming students than the number of their outgoing applicants who are placed
- Even will accept incoming applicants not to exceed the number of their own outgoing
- 1:1 will accept students only from those campuses at which their own students are placed
