The committee is now working on pulling together the budget for the 2018-2019 academic year. In addition, the Finance Committee works with the LLI office to determine budgets for office expenditures, capital outlays, computer updates and maintenance, and salary estimates for the year.



The Finance Committee then gathers information about expected income that funds all these expenses. As could be expected, the lion's share of our income is derived from membership dues. We currently have 1,048 members. All this information, once put into the final budget, is then presented to the general membership at the May annual meeting. 

Registration Changes

Starting with the fall 2018 registration— There will be no Supplemental Registration period. What does this mean? Supplemental registration is registration that takes place after the initial registration period. Members use this time to add additional courses or to waitlists courses. As a member can register for thirty classes there does not seem to be any reason supplemental registration. If a member wants to enroll or waitlist a class that the member is not currently enrolled it is the responsibility of that member to contact the coordinator of the class an inform him/her that the member wishes to take the class. Coordinators will formulate a waitlist from the members that contact him/her. No waitlists will be kept by the office. Supplemental registration puts a strain on the LLI Office staff and volunteers. Eliminating that strain will allow the office to operate more effectively.
