

#### **ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS AND PROVISIONS**

1. Course equivalencies used in this Articulation Agreement are subject to change in the event that the course curriculum of either institution was to change.
2. Courses must be posted on an official transcript for students to receive credits from the Agreement.
3. Each institution has the right and responsibility to make changes to its curricula and enrollment standards to maintain its academic integrity and meet accreditation standards. Such changes, if any, will be communicated to the other institution as they occur through the office of each institution responsible for implementing this Agreement.
4. To receive the credit transfer set forth within this Articulation Agreement, the candidate must have received an associate degree through the LTC Associate Degree program.
5. Both parties agree that failure to maintain regional accreditation will be grounds for termination of the Agreement.
6. This Articulation Agreement is effective February 2022, and will be reviewed annually on June 1, after any changes to the Undergraduate Catalog at UWGB have been approved. Both LTC and the UWGB agree to notify each other of any curricular changes in a timely manner.
