Notes:

Note: any of WI native spring flowering willows are recommended as important early spring bee resources.

Note: any of the native Allium species are good for bees.

Note: all of the native milweeds are good bee/butterfly plants.

Note: any of the WI native Rosa are recommended. Beware of Rosa multiflora - this species is not native - it is ecologically invasive.

Note: any of the native Rubus are recommended.

Note: all of the native milweeds are good bee/butterfly plants.

Note: only plant native Campanula. European C. rapunculoides is ecologically invasive and restricted in WI.

Warning: several thistle species are ecologically invasive and restricted in WI.

I only recommend using native thistles, which some species of bumble bees love!

Note: Wintergreen does best on sandy soils

Warning: make sure that you plant the native species, NOT Common St. John's Wort (*Hypericum perforatum*), which is ecologically invasive.

Note: any of the native sunflowers are recommended
