

ATP: Moving UW Forward

The Administrative Transformation Program began laying the groundwork to standardize finance, human resources, and research administration processes across the UW System in 2019. In 2021, Workday was selected as the system UW staff will use to perform most administrative functions at every UW institution. Additionally, we will use some modules of Huron Research Suite to conduct some research administration tasks.

Why ATP?

How many systems and spreadsheets do you use to complete your work? Across the UW System more than 1800 disconnected systems and spreadsheets are used to perform administrative processes and tasks. Work for staff in admin roles can be inefficient, frustrating, and limit access to helpful data that would benefit everyone across the System.

ATP aims to fix that. We're partnering with all UW institutions to standardize processes and implement Workday and Huron Research Suite, allowing us to retire many existing, outdated systems we use today including Human Resource System (HRS) and Shared Financial System (SFS). By replacing them with modern, integrated systems, we can:

- Introduce simplified, consistent business processes across departments, divisions, and schools
- Improve the user experience for all UW faculty and staff — and especially administrative staff
- Collect better data to ensure we're making the best decisions
- Reduce risks related to audits and information security
