- Why and how to deliver SBIRT: The training will include an emphasis on Motivational Interviewing, which is effective in promoting a variety of healthier behaviors. Trainees will receive copies of training materials.
- Certain trainees will be qualified to bill Wisconsin Medicaid for SBIRT.
- SAMHSA requires that trainees complete two brief evaluation forms – one in writing at the conclusion of the training, and another by email one month later. WIPHL will email training completion certificates after both evaluation forms are completed.
