Presentation Remarks from Linda Peacock-Landrum, Director of Career Services

Since 2007, Career Services at UW-Green Bay has recognized an employer partner, which shows exceptional commitment evidenced by support and opportunities for our students and graduates. This employer partner also demonstrates comprehensive support for the mission of Career Services.Today, we recognize our valued partner, Wipfli as our Recruitment Partner of the Year for 2018.
