

Career Services Resources for Marinette Campus Students

Be sure to connect first with an advisor on the Marinette Campus to see if your career needs can be addressed in person. Bethany Welch is the Career Services contact for the Marinette Campus.

- 1. Individual Assistance: Currently enrolled students are eligible for individual appointments with Career Services. Appointments can be scheduled via telephone, Skype, or in person on the main campus. Please call our main office at 920-465-2163 to schedule with a staff member. Appointments need to be scheduled during office hours that are 7:45am-4:30pm CST Monday-Friday. Students may also email the office with questions at careers@uwgb.edu using your school email address. Use of your school email address is the first step to verify current enrollment status as a student.
- 2. Workshops & Programs: Each year Career Services does record a variety of workshops on special topics. Once recorded, the workshops are made available to students in the RESOURCES section of Handshake. All enrolled students have an account in Handshake based on their school email address. If you have questions about how to access these programs, please contact a member of our staff or email our office at <u>careers@uwab.edu</u>.
- **3. Website Resources:** The website for Career Services (www.uwgb.edu/careers) has a wealth of information to assist students. This includes, but is not limited to, sample resumes, questions to prepare for interviews, sample cover letters and other professional correspondence, job and internship resources that are online and many other resources.
- **4. Career Spots:** Career Spots videos are accessible from the Career Services website. A variety of topics are addressed from career ready skills, getting a government job, your personal brand, to an elevator pitch, interview tips and more.
- **5. Vault:** This is an online career and employment library. Access is provided via registration with Vault using a school email address. Accounts are created annually for enrolled students. Books and other materials are available for download. It is accessible via the Career Services home page at www.uwgb.edu/careers.
- 6. Career Locker: This is an online career assessment used to explore occupations and career areas. Students wishing to access the resource can request a registration code and information guide about using it from Bethany Welch on the Marinette Campus at welchb@uwgb.edu or Career Services via email to careers@uwgb.edu
- 7. Handshake: Through Handshake you can search for all types of internships and jobs, view upcoming workshops and employer events, and get information on upcoming job and internship fairs.
