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Catalog Descriptions

The Foundations of Reading Test (FoRT) is a requirement for most teacher initial teacher licenses in grades kindergarten through 5 or special education, or for a license as a reading teacher or reading specialist in the state of Wisconsin. The FoRT a content exam focusing on instructional knowledge and skills related to the teaching of reading in kindergarten through middle school. Preparing for the Foundations of Reading Test is a one-credit pass/fall test-prep course designed for individuals who have a basic understanding of literacy instruction. Through online self-guided reviews course participants will have a better understanding of the concepts and vocabulary highlighted on the FoRT. Short quizzes will ensure that content is mastered and provide participants with knowledge of what needs to be further addressed. During in-class meetings the structure of the test and test questions will be analyzed so that participants know what to anticipate when taking the exam.
