## Study Abroad

An average of 10% of UW-Green Bay students study abroad during their undergraduate degree program. UW-Green Bay provides study abroad opportunities from one-week to one-year in duration, and most programs of study are represented. Many exchange programs exist, allowing UWGB students to pay low tuition rates as if on campus while participating in an overseas experience. The majority of UWGB study abroad students participate in short-term faculty-led programs of approximately 2 weeks in duration.

## Advising for Study Abroad

Study Abroad is a critical component of a comprehensive liberal arts education. Studies show that students who study abroad have improved academic performance and higher rates of graduation. When advising a student about study abroad, keep in mind 3 things:

- You don't have to wait for a student to ask you about study abroad; pose the question, "Have you considered participating in a study abroad program?"
- Work with students to perform course substitutions. Not every class offered abroad is an exact match to courses at UW-Green Bay; that's the point! Allow for flexibility in transferability.
- Don't hesitate to refer students to the Office of International Education. Without encouragement, a student may never visit the OIE, and we can spend time with each student in selecting a program that is right for them.
