- Receive and review financial aid applications, the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
- Award and disburse federal and state financial aid funds of approximately \$36 million per year for UW
  Green Bay's undergraduate student population
- Advise students on additional funding options and process additional non-federal types of aid
- Follow and meet federal and state compliance requirements

- There are more than 1,000 student employment positions on campus in a typical year.
- Manage the Federal Work Study (FWS) program. This includes answering questions from students and employers (on campus and off campus), reconciling UW System payroll, maintaining off campus FWS employer contracts
- Compile data on FWS students for annual federal reporting requirements involving follow up and tracking of jobs to report to the Department of Education on an annual basis

# Veterans and Service Members in Your Classroom



There are over 450 veterans and dependents of veterans receiving education benefits on campus this year. Of this number, 300 are military veterans or current service members. Some of these students are on active duty one week and in the classroom the next. This is just one reason the transition from military service to the community can be very unsettling.

As School Certifying Officials for Veteran education benefits, Nicole Stockman and Jamee Haslam handle the processing of veteran education benefits for all UWGB veterans, military personnel and dependents of veterans. Sometimes faculty and staff have questions regarding military activation or want to refer a student to a veteran program in the community. We have many contacts within the Green Bay Veteran community; including the Green Bay Veteran Clinic, the Green Bay Vet Center and the Brown County Veteran Office.

UW – Green Bay is UW VETS Certified since 2016 and continues to promote and uphold our strong Veteran friendly culture. The Veteran Support Team is comprised of employees from all areas on campus and student veterans; meets twice per semester to review challenges and Veteran focused ideas.
