- PSYCH 203 is a prerequisite for SOC WORK 371: Human Behavior in the Social Environment and must be **completed before spring semester** of the junior year.
- SOC WORK 275 is a prerequisite for SOC WORK 431: Social Policy I and must be **completed before fall semester** of the senior year.
