Midwest Viking Festival



Join us on September 23-24, 2022 at the UW-Green Bay Viking House grounds to explore Scandinavian history and the daily life of the region more than a 1,000 years ago! It's a free community event that celebrates the craft traditions, food, stories, and many other aspects of medieval Scandinavia (Denmark, Iceland, Norway, and Sweden). The festival runs from 10am – 4pm Sep. 23rd and 24th

The performance and demonstration schedule is the same for both days:

10:15am	Sven Tunheim tells tales of the Vikings
11:00am	Battle demonstration
11:30am	Kari Tauring “Healing our kinship to Nature” The Old Norse word ætt encompasses both family and place of origin. How did Iron Age people understand themselves as part of place? Our ancient poetry has some answers. Breathing with the trees of our origin, singing to wake up the plants, calling to lure in the land spirits, and sounding nature instruments confirmed our ancestors belonging, their ætt. This can be medicine for our own time of climate crisis and social upheavals.
12:30pm	Sven Tunhaim tells tales of the Vikings
1:30pm	Kari Tauring “Frith and Grith: Divine Female Boundary Setters” Meaning Peace and Truce, these mystic female entities appear in Edda and Saga poetry. Their stories help us understand good boundary setting. The lessons of Peace and Truce are as essential in times of change and disruption. Learn about Frith and Grith with humor and embodiment. We will form a circle dance at the end of the presentation.
