- Secured approval from DOA to purchase UREC vehicles.










## **CLIMBING TOWER**

#### **Shorewood Center**

UREC's home for outdoor recreation moved to into the former Shorewood Golf Course Clubhouse, now known as the Shorewood Center for Outdoor Adventure Recreation and Student Engagement.

- IT Upgrades: ID door reader, cameras, and TV.




#### **Fusion**

UREC implemented Fusion, a rec management software to streamline our daily operations. Fusion makes it easy to manage members, facility access, sales, rental equipment, and more.

- Moved and reconfigured the functional training rig in the fitness center.
- Installed 52 smart rails in the lower bowl bleachers of the Event Center.

- Installed 2 new Ice Machines.
- Ordered a new dryer.
- Ordered a dedicated riding floor scrubber to manage wood floors.
- Created pool renovation committee.
- Ordered keyed mulleins for Event Center and Bennett gym.
- Bleacher, batting cage, turf netting, and basketball hoop inspections and repairs.
- Coordinated snow removal at the softball field for women's softball.
- Softball turf repairs and replacement.
- Gmax tested Aldo Santaga stadium, King Park, and the indoor turf facility to develop a grooming plan.
- Painted both visiting team rooms in the event center.
- Facilitated bleachers and porta johns for women's softball season.
- Moved intramurals and club sports into space previously occupied by Outdoor Adventure.

"At work I have been learning ways to work with others, be time efficient, and manage conflicts when they arise."




Students participating in University Recreation activities report an increased sense of belonging/association to UW-Green Bay.

Measured through participant surveys.




## ASSESSMENT

Measured using a sample of participants that utilized the Kress Events Center regularly throughout the academic year and taking their composite GPA in comparison to the general student body.




Spring 2022 GPA

## ASSESSMENT


UREC will coordinate, facilitate and host GB Phoenix Athletics, campus and community events that demonstrate community engagement for the university.
