VI. Reports

b. Arts & Cultural fee.

Tanisha: We are going to have Gail talk about the Arts & Cultural fund Gail: The chancellor really wanted to be here, but he has his Councell Trushti dinner. So, he cannot be here, but he will be coming in on Thursday to explain more about it. He recently met with me and leadership about what he would like to see the students invest in an Arts & Culture fee. The examination and as we look at the current sik fee structure we are having a lot of permission for the student's experience. But there is nothing in the lineup that supports the arts and culture. We do have the flashtik that has been funded out of the Student Engemen funs, but we may be trying something different moving forward. We know our chancellor comes from an arts and cultural background, and he is a mussitation by trade and would like to see our students exposed by music, dance, performance or whatever the case would be. He has approached leadership. Tanisha and Karime with the idea of potentially funding. I do not want to step on his toes. He does have a few ideas on how the students can fund that at least for a year and not have much impact on the students. To try and try it out and see if it is something that would land well on our campuses. He wants this to be seen over the arts and performance committee with Kelly Stricklen, our director of the Widner performing art center. He thought of a lot of clever ideas at our meeting about how we could potentially use it. He is not looking at request a million dollars or hafe a million dollars he is thinking about \$25,000 to \$30,000 capture are current need and be able to hance are other events and activities that are going on. It is not meant to compete with division one athletics, not ment to compete with all the wonderful things that the Student Engagement Center does. It is to inhanse and to add more arts and culture and as I explained to Tanisha and Karime it is up to the student who sits on that committee to help with the direction it goes. We had bubbles. I really hope you all got to see the bubbles. It could be funding for another traveling art show, it could be holding a concert on campus. I know \$30,000 is not Taylor Swift money but it may be Brittney Speers' money and so working with Kelly Strickman and to help guide the money and how students see it fit for arts & culture. Some campuses are doing across the nation is buying large sculptures that represent their campus. So, we could do a large Phlash or several of them and different orgs would compete to be able to decorate them and have them displayed for a year or two years. A lot of large, scaled art displayed on campus is not particularly good and has been there a long time. That would help us freshen up or liven our campus. It would primarily be for our students and those who sit on the Arts and

Performance and input from SGA.

Radwa: I just want clarification. Can you give more of an example of what you mean by arts and culture?

Gail: I am resident because what arts and culture is to me may not be what art and culture is to you. On of the things that came to mind was. I have been here for just a little over a decade and I do not recall a time on these campuses we had done and exbudishion like a step show. That typically me is arts and culture. It is in addition of to what the Widner brings in is cool. Is that what the students want more of or is there something else that is cool? I do not know because we have long winters here and in February could we do Ice sculptors in Phoenix Park. Like bring in artiest like that to help enhance our campus through the long winter. I really want our students to be creative. Like I never thought we would have giant bubbles displayed on our campus for a month. They brought in well over 10,000 people to look at them. It does not have to be sympathy. How I look at it is that students are having fun. Of course this is the chancellor's passion point. I encourage you if you can come on Thursday and really listen to his ideas. I think he does better than I do. I told Karime and Tanisha to look at it as a 3 chair one is Division one athletics, the student engagement center and then the arts and culture. With that I yield.

Radwa: would that be \$25,000 to \$30,000 every year or semester.

Adam/Tanisha: A year.

Lucas B: On Thursday we approved the SGA request for \$25,000. Is that a disregard or

something?

Tanisha: No, you approved the request for flashtiks. This is different.

Lucas B: we approved that Tanisha/Karime: Okay

Radwa: So would the money come out of SUFAC that would be allocating it.

Tanisha: So, it would be SUFAC allocating it would be around \$5.00 a person but I do not like to say that because it would all depends on if they are part time or full time. It is around \$5 a student for a year.

Radwa: So, would it come out of our tuition or increase our tuition?

Tanisha: If they were to do it the way sik fees are to increase is weird. I do not even know how to explain it. You would have to talk to Lucas. But it would be coming out of Sik fees. We are just trying to do a pilot program for now and it will not affect students now. But in the future if we do decide to move forward with this it will be coming out in Sik feeds if we can fit it in.

Gail: It is to have zero impact Initially.

Karime: It is more just to see how the students enjoy doing it. **Radwa:** If we do decide to do it. Would non-students have to pay?

Tanisha: That is a good question, and I think the Intier point of it is what the students wants. This is through Kayla and whoever takes this position next semester. It is going to be through them and Kelly Strickler. Mostly we plan out what they want to do because we want it to be student based and what they want. That is something that their committee wants to give a concert, it would be free to the students and \$5.00 for non-UWGB students. It is the money where students and the committee will choice where it is put. If that is, we want more stuff with the bubbles or more concerts.

Gail: If we were to do a ticketed event, my strong suggestion would be that community members would not attend for free on students' money.

Nathan: I am just wondering what kind of deliberately you would be using to measure. You said about 10,000 people attended the bubble. Would this be more engagement?

Gail: It is engagement especially with our students. We know what is popular already. I am not doing Student Engagement you know how much I love you folks and the traditional programs that we do. We got hypnotism that comes in and the coffee house performers and BINGO. Student Engagement only has so much money and this lets us dream different and bigger. \$25,000 is still \$25,000 but it makes it possible to be able to do things that we have not been able to do in the past. When I think of deliberately, I do think about attendance and

ideas. Mabey one evet makes us think eh it lets us dream bigger. Look around and see what other college campuses do. Discover it and bring it the Northeaster side of Wisconsin. Our campus is changing and growing. More energy than in past years. It is to look at what we can do. Athletics are brought in more numbers, Flashtik is bringing in more money than in past years. Seems like a good year because I feel like we are ready. Attended is it

Lucas B: Do you know if anyone will use the park fund sitting there? It is just sitting there, and no one is using it.

Gail: That is something we have been starting to look at. There is a \$250,000 allotment to the Phoenix Park fund. There have been a few ideas through the years. The last of my knowledge to do anything the Phoenix Park was precovid. The money had just sat there in hopes that something would be done. But we hoped we could take \$25,00 to \$30,000 out of there on a one-year basis. Is this something that will grow legs, students going to enjoy?

Radwa: It is a good idea especially if we are doing something in the park for ice sculptures or things like that. It will draw people to the park

Gail: There has been discussion on it for a long time not in your group. They have discution on a large-scale artwork in Phoenix Park. Everyone wants to get a picture of or with it and it becomes iconic for UWGB. That could be very well to band that park and arts & culture together.

Lucas B: So, it is just sitting there just in case someone wants to use it.

Seamus: You said that it is about trying to get what the students want. It is also where students can show off their work as well.

Gail: I do not see why it can, but we would have to develop a mechanism. What is it? A student shows how it is selected when it is. Why not? We have some incredible taste right here on campus or are we selecting students to do a merroir on campus? It is up to the students and their ideas. If the money is granted that it is up to the students.

Tanisha: I will go with what Karime, and I were thinking. So, when we went into the meeting with the chancellor it was news to us. We have not been here all summer, so we have not been interacting with people. The way this was pitched to us was the initial point of SGA is for the students by the students. Having the money like sustainability funds would be beneficial for us. No one knows better than us. So, to have that money in student control for students for 1.) get the skills to put something like that on as a reamer builder or something like that as having the money within students control and what we want. Something that I brought up was. I came in 2021, and Karime was slightly before that and the thing I noticed from my class and the ones under that is that we stayed in are room and we did not really do anything on campus.
