



# WisCaregiver Careers Resource Guide for Managed Care Organizations (MCOs)

This MCO Guide provides information and resources about WisCaregiver Careers that MCOs can share with their long-term care providers and individuals who self-direct their services.

WisCaregiver Careers aims to ensure all members have competent caregivers to help them live their best lives. It is a statewide program that helps caring people start or grow their health care careers by offering **free online training** and cash bonuses.

## Benefits the CDCP program offers to specific provider types and how to get started

#### • 1-2 bed Adult Family Homes (AFHs)

- The CDCP program along with two free supplemental trainings, meet all the required training standards. The free supplemental microcredential training courses include: Resident Rights in All HCBS Settings and Medication Administration.
- o CDCP certification fulfills annual staff training requirements.
- Actions to take:

  - Register as a WisCaregiver Careers employer.
  - Join WisCaregiver Connections to post jobs and get on the <u>employer map</u> to find caregivers.

  - Encourage staff to sign up for the free CDCP certification and earn available cash bonuses.

#### Other providers serving Family Care members

- CDCP certification partially meets Wisconsin administrative code training requirements for 3-4 bed adult family homes (AFH), community based residential facilities (CBRF), resident care apartment complexes (RCAC), personal care agencies (PCA), and substance use treatment or behavioral health providers. - CDCP certification meets part of the <u>MCO Training and Documentation Standards for Supportive Home Care-P-01602</u>
  (07/2025) under section IV. Types of supportive home care services in Section V; personal assistance services: worker training standards.

1. How to register as a WisCaregiver Careers CDCP employer

Providers and SDS employers can grow their workforce at **no cost** by registering online as a CDCP employer.

- Complete the <u>CDCP Employer Application</u>.
- Watch this short <u>how-to video</u> for guidance.
- Once approved, the provider organization appears automatically on the CDCP employer map.
- 2. How to use WisCaregiver Connections to post jobs and search a statewide database of trained caregivers

  After completing the CDCP Employer Application, providers receive an email from UW-GB with employer setup instructions for Handshake. Handshake is the system behind WisCaregiver Connections, so each provider must set up an account.

- 3. How to sign up staff for free CDCP certification and earn available cash bonuses
  - CDCP program is free and open to anyone. There's no prior experience or age requirement. Encourage your providers and SDS members to get started with this CDCP fact sheet.
  - CDCPs receive a \$250 bonus upon being hired and an additional \$250 six-month retention bonus if they are employed by an eligible agency or provider. There is no cost to the provider for this bonus. In addition, providers who are registered on WisCaregiver Connections can encourage their current staff to earn the CDCP certification and become qualified to receive available cash bonuses.
